The PChAD Act helps children under 18 years of age whose use of alcohol or drugs is likely to cause significant psychological or physical harm to themselves or physical harm to others. The PChAD program allows you, as a legal guardian, to ask the Court for a protection order. This order will mean your child can be taken to a protective safe house for up to 10 days, even if he/she does not want to go. During this period, your child will be provided with a structured and protective setting in which to begin detoxification, while providing parents an opportunity to get involved in the process. The time spent in the protective safe house also allows counsellors a chance to assess your child's substance use and offer treatment recommendations to follow once they have been discharged from the program.
