School Profile:

Eastview Middle School is in its 68th year of operations, having opened in 1956. Its feeder elementary schools include G.W. Smith, Joseph Welsh, Barrie Wilson, Mountview, and Annie L. Gaetz, drawing from the communities of Anders, Aspen Ridge, Clearview Meadows, Eastview, Eastview Estates, Grandview, Inglewood, Ironstone, Michener, Mountview, Rosedale Estates, Rosedale Meadows, and Southbrook. Eastview Middle School includes students in grades six through eight, with a school population anticipated to be approximately 640 students for the 2024-25 school year. Eastview has 33 teaching staff, including administration, and 21 support staff.

Anecdotal Results, Analysis and Action

Analysis:

• We are excited about the survey results. The stakeholder consensus demonstrates a positive trend in both sets of results. Students are achieving high in both the District and Province in Literacy and Numeracy. We are particularly happy with the perception of our teaching staff and students in regards to our overall school goal. We are continuing to look at more ways in which we can engage our parents to complete this survey to receive more meaningful data.

Action:

• School Success and Completion. Many of our students have gaps in their learning, so we continue to focus on literacy and numeracy. After two years of targeted Numeracy and Literacy intervention classes, the data demonstrates that students feel more confident in their Numeracy and Literacy curriculums.

Anecdotal Results, Analysis and Action

Analysis:

- Our stakeholders have reported a 2.5% increase that students are feeling safe at school, are learning the importance of caring for others, are learning respect for others and are treated fairly in school.
- Our teachers feel that students have a sense of belonging through their involvement in school activities and the people they connect with.
- Our students have reported promising results.
 - Overall percentage of students who feel they are connected and feel a sense of belonging at school showed an increase of 5.5% from the previous year.
 - Overall percentage of students who feel they are learning in ways that are meaningful and appropriate- showed an increase of 4.0% from the previous year.
- RDPSD survey demonstrated that results from our parent stakeholders have increased in all categories.

Action:

- We continue to focus on the culture of Eastview Middle School as a priority. It is a priority at EMS to ensure that equity is at the forefront of all decisions that we make as admin and teachers.
- Our goal is to engage our EVMS parents through monthly surveys and use their feedback to help guide decisions being made within our building.
- We have invested in numerous supports to assist our students with the support they require. For instance, we have a full time counselor and a family wellness worker, as well as a full time Student Support Room (SSR).
- Our EMS Intervention Team meets weekly to address students that require wrap-around support and interventions.

Anecdotal Results, Analysis and Action

Analysis:

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- Characteristics of active citizenship continue to improve at EVMS. This is important as it was a large focus for our leadership team the past two years. Steadily rising in our 3-year trend.
- We can see a noticeable improvement in regards to students being taught the attitudes and behaviours that will make them successful at work when they finish school. Up 4% from the previous year.

Action:

- We will continue offering monthly town halls (grade level specific) to recognize and celebrate student achievement and teach positive behavior expectations. At these town halls we also address emergent issues and behaviors being exhibited that month.
- We have continued to make an effort to bring in community resources and guest speakers to address skills and attitudes that will assist students to be successful in the grade they are in, future grades, and life after high school.

Anecdotal Results, Analysis and Action

Analysis:

• Our results have continued to demonstrate a positive trend forward. Our results yield much higher results than the provinces' averages and we are proud of our indigenous students in relation to this achievement.

Action:

- Jordan's Principle- we now have a designated Educational Assistant that works specifically with our Indigenous students.
- We are providing support to our FNMI students through our Intervention Team. Students are identified that require wrap around support, and then we develop an action plan to address needs with our students and possible families.
- Indigenous studies is offered to explore culture, language and traditional ways of knowing. Indigenous Studies is offered once a month to any students interested in taking part.
- Our counselor and family wellness worker are all actively involved weekly with our students.
- EVMS has a dedicated group of staff that focus on promoting, celebrating and embedding indigenous culture into our school.
